THE RIGHT HONOURABLE EDWIN MONTAGU,

*His Majesty's Secretary of State for India.**Sindia, the 3rd June 1920.*

SIR,

With reference to our despatch No. 2, dated the 29th January 1920, we have the honour to forward a copy of a letter No. 5485, dated the 14th May 1920, which we have received from the Government of Bombay, recommending that the clerical work in connection with the emigration of Indian coolies for the Uganda Railway, on the transfer of its agency from Karachi to Bombay, may be performed by the clerk employed in the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Bombay, and that for the performance of this work he may be given an allowance of Rs. 30 a month at the cost of the Uganda Railway Administration.

2. We have no objection to the recommendations now made by the Local Government and request that, in modification of the proposals contained in our despatch of the 29th January 1920, referred to above, the assent of the Uganda Railway Administration to the payment of this allowance on its account may be obtained.

To - The Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Commerce.

I am directed to refer to your letter No. 679-D, dated the 29th January 1920, intimating that the Government of India have recommended for the acceptance of the Secretary of State the proposal submitted by this Government in letter No. 208, dated the 8th January 1920, for the further extension of service to the clerk employed at Karachi in connection with the exfiltration of Indian coolies for the Uganda Railway and his transfer from the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Karachi, to that of the Protector of Emigrants, Bombay.

2. I am now to say that the clerk employed in the Karachi Protector's office is not willing to be transferred to Bombay on the ground of health. In these circumstances the Government of Bombay propose that the clerical work in connection with the registration of emigrants for the Uganda Railway, on the transfer of its Agency from Karachi to Bombay, may be performed, in addition to his existing duties by the clerk employed in the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Bombay, and that for the performance of this work he may be given an allowance of Rs. 20 a month at the cost of the Uganda Railway Administration. I am to request that this proposal may be submitted to the Secretary of State for India for acceptance in modification of the proposal submitted with my letter, dated the 8th January last.
