Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that I am desirous of leaving the service of the East Africa Protectorate if I can obtain a piece of land suitable for mixed farming during the course of my duty I am obliged to visit feverish localities and repeated attacks of malaria have caused a most terrible degree of weakness which Sir Patrick Geddes has certified will increase with future attacks and doses of quinine. This is my only reason for wishing to leave.

There are many blocks of land lying between the Forest Reserve and allotted farms and I understand that these are sometimes allotted by special arrangement of His Excellency. Would it be possible to obtain a grant of such a piece of land? I believe the usual way of dealing with applications for these blocks is for the applicant to guarantee to put the usual improvements on the land and to bid at public auction for it. While I have ample funds for the development of a 200 acre farm it would not suit me to bid at auction because if the price was high my finances might be crippled.

I should be very grateful indeed therefore if in consideration of my service of 10 years at a very small salary a special case could be made on my behalf and the land granted without the necessity of a public auction.

I enclose two plans showing vacant pieces of land and have written on them the order of estates. One plan shows land available between the Eastern Aberdare and the West Kenya farms. The other a piece of land near the Railway line at Loniani.

I do not wish for a farm in the Elgon Allotments
as I fear it is too far from the Railway and a market
for produce and I cannot afford to wait several years
without an income.
