Sir,

In confirmation of my telegram of to-day I have the honour to report that Mr James B Ainsworth, Provincial Commissioner at Kitui, was landed at the Egyptian Hospital at Suez from the Messageries s.s. "Natal" suffering from malaria, to which I regret to say that he succumbed on the 10th instant.

At present I have no information as to his relatives, but Mr Lockwood, the British Pro-Consul at Suez, discovered amongst his effects a luggage-table marked James B Ainsworth; The Seelands, Victoria Avenue, Cheadle Hulme near Stockport, to which address he had cabled the sad news. Mr Lockwood is preparing an inventory of his effects, and has meanwhile sent me particulars of the books and papers of the deceased, of which I enclose a copy.

I am sending a copy of this despatch to His Excellency the Governor & Commander-in-Chief, East Africa Protectorate, and would beg for instructions as to the disposal of the effects. In the meantime, I shall be obliged to defray the funeral and hospital expenses, which may however, possibly exceed the total amount of cash viz £28 found in possession of the deceased.
