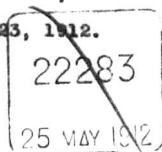

With reference to my despatch No. 152 Commercial of November 7th last I have the honour to report that I am in receipt of a note from the Under Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs stating that, provided that British East Africa adheres to the International Convention in regard to measures for the prevention of Plague, Cholera and Yellow Fever of December 3, 1903, the German Government are prepared to announce the simultaneous accession of German East Africa to this Convention. Herr Zimmermann accordingly requests that he may be informed in regard to the accession of British East Africa, in order that the necessary steps may be taken to arrange for the simultaneous accession of German East Africa.
