that the districts of Urundi and Ruanda have a population of about four millions and possess about 500,000 cattle and two million sheep and goats. The soil is also suitable for agriculture and the district is particularly fitted by its cool climate for settlement by Europeans. The exports of Ruanda amounted in 1910 to 1½ million Marks, the greater part of which was carried by the Uganda Railway.

The Northern Railway of German East Africa which at present goes as far as Moschi, would, if continued to Aruscha, open up the populous and fertile country in the neighbourhood of the Meru Mountain.

Rule 15 Unlike our Rule 7, this deals with assignment of a share or interest in a Trade Mark, and "partial proprietorship".

Rules 21, 22, 23. Deal only with the applicant for registration - and for some reason omit the registered proprietor, who is equally to be afforded a hearing under Clause 53 of the Ordinance.

Fees. The Schedule does not comprise all the fees authorized by our Act - but probably the Colony have considered this point.

Item 3. "Representation" should be altered to "Mark".

Classification of goods.

Class 14. Alter to "tools of practice which are".

Class 23. There is no agreement, save on my own division of this class if departed from, viz. - (a) cotton yarn (b) sewing cotton.

Class 29. Alter to "Jute yarn and tissues and other articles, &c."

Class 37. Alter to "Leather, skins, and articles made of leather, etc."

Form of application (Schedule Part IV.) "Registration fees herewith" should be altered to "Application fees herewith".
