Sir,

With further reference to your letter of the 10th January 1912, No: 39072/11, and to War Office letter of the 19th idem, numbered as above, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you, for Mr. Secretary Harcourt's information, that there is no objection to Officers of the Territorial Force, who are not seconded, and who may be temporarily resident in the East African Protectorate, being permitted to perform their drills, annual training &c., for not more than two years in succession with the King's African Rifles. They would only be entitled to pay from Army funds while attached for the period prescribed for the training of their Territorial Force unit at home.

The question of the procedure to be adopted in respect of the attachment of officers and men of the Territorial Force to Colonial and regular units in the Overseas Dominions is at present under consideration and a further communication will be addressed to you on the subject.
