I have today examined Mr G.E. Jeaffreson, Clerk in the Bombay Agency of the East African Protectorates, and have the honour to report that the discharge from the liver abscess from which he has been suffering has ceased for 17 days. His general health is very good. It may be the abscess has soundly healed; on the other hand it may be that ^{the} orifice only of the abscess has closed. In order to settle this point I have given him certain directions and would suggest that he be granted extension of leave for one month and re-examination about the 10th of May.

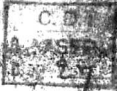
