Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th. instant and to tender you my hearty thanks for the extension of leave on half-pay which has been granted me. Unfortunately it does not cover the whole of the period for which, in the opinion of my medical advisers, I am incapacitated from business as I was only discharged from hospital on the 27th. instant with orders to remain quietly at home for a month.

The Hon. the Treasurer of the East African Protectorate omitted to credit me in my April pay-sheet with the increment which accrued due on the 1st. of that month and I trust I am in order in requesting you to be good enough to obtain payment thereof and to authorise the Crown Agents to calculate my pay at the advanced rate from the 28th. April.

I deeply regret that my application for further employment should be viewed in the manner expressed in para. 3 of your letter, and earnestly request that the matter may be reconsidered.
