In reply to your Confidential despatch of the 10th of October 1912, on the subject of plantation rubber, I have the honour to inform you that I am advised that the imposition of an Export Duty of 2½ per cent ad valorem on all plantation rubber exported from this Protectorate, without distinction, will not be a breach of any covenant express or implied, in any existing grant or lease of Government land.

2. I am accordingly taking the necessary steps for the preparation of an ordinance giving effect to this arrangement.

3. I have been in communication with the Officer Administering the Government of Uganda on the subject and have informed him of the action which I am taking.

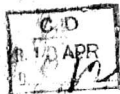
