Sir,

I have the honour to express my regret
for the delay which has taken place in replying to
your Confidential Dispatch of September 12th
respecting the rates of wages paid to labour.

2. I am sorry to say

that the Departmental Head Office
is considerably staffed up late and I have had
considerable difficulty in getting reports from
various stations referred to in it, of which this
is one.

3. It appears that Government is now paying
labour at the rate of Rs.5 per mansam with
rations, an increase of Rs.1 per mansam over the
old rate, and even with this enhanced wage it is
difficult to recruit throughout the year.

4. I am anxious not to offer much more than
the ordinary amount paid by planters and farmers,
and, as a matter of fact, at certain seasons of the
year no implement can be put forward which will
attract the native, who is at such times anxious to
cultivate his own land.

Sir,

I have the honour to express my regret for the delay which has taken place in replying to your Confidential Message of September 12th respecting the rates of wages paid to labour.

22nd January 1913

1. I understand that the world's Department Head Office is at present staffed up to date and I have had considerable difficulty in getting results on the subject. This question is referred to it, of which this is the first time.

2. It appears that Government is now paying labour at the rate of Rs.5 per mensem with rations, an increase of Rs.1 per mensem over the old rate, and even with this enhanced wage it is difficult to recruit throughout the year.

3. I am anxious not to offer much more than the average amount paid by planters and farmers, and, as a matter of fact, at certain seasons of the year no instructions can be put forward which will attract the native, who is at such times anxious to cultivate his own land.

5. Just at present the situation is not so strained and a considerable amount of labour is forthcoming, but the difficulty is certain to recur.

6. The Commission which is now sitting and considering evidence from all classes of the community will, however, I trust be able to evolve some solution of the problem.
