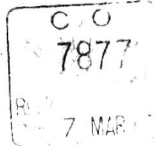

Sir,

I have the honour to report that I have authorised a re-allocation of £200 from the amount of £350 allowed on the current year's Estimates under Public Works Extraordinary Item 32 Sub Police Station at Kilindini, for the building of a Police Gymnasium at Nairobi.

2. The circumstances are as follows:-

It was hoped that the scheme for the new deep water pier at Kilindini would be sufficiently far advanced to allow of the erection of the new Police Station at Kilindini this year. Unfortunately however a final settlement has not yet been arrived at and the building must therefore wait for the time being.

3. The Commissioner of Police was most anxious

anxious to have a gymnasium in the Depot lines Nairobi and inserted in his draft estimates provision for its erection. I could not however at the time allow this to stand as there were other urgent works which I thought should have priority.

4. There would appear to be no reason now for delaying the building of the gymnasium especially as I am satisfied that it is really needed.

5. I have therefore signed a Special Warrant for £200 providing for the re-allocation indicated above and I trust that my action will meet with approval.
