I have the honour to asknowledge the receipt of your Confidential despatch of the 23rd of January on the subject of the desirability of appeinting Indian Assessors to assist in hearing important cases in which Indians are conserned, and to inform you in reply that the point at issue will probably be covered by a new section which His Honour the Chief Justice has inserted in the draft Civil Procedure Ordinance new in course of preparation.

2. The section as drafted provides that any Court may, if it thinks fit, and shall on the application of a party in any case in which questions may arise as to the law or customs of any tribe, community or caste, summon to its assistance one or more competent assessors.
