I do not think the fact of the annual and biannual increases can be used as a lever for the appointment of an additional staff. Such a contingency must often have occurred before the same applies to the annual medical report.

Sir,

I have the honour to report that it has been found necessary to make provision in the draft Estimates for 1915-16 for an additional fourth Grade clerk in the office of the Principal Medical Officer.

2. The work of the Medical Department has of late increased to such an extent that with the normal establishment it is impossible to cope with it even by considerably prolonging the customary office hours; and as the Assistant Clerk, in addition to the Principal Medical Officer, is due to proceed on leave at the end of this month, it is evident that, unless additional clerical assistance is forthcoming, the arrears of work will accumulate very rapidly.

3. The impending preparation of the Annual Medical Report will involve much additional labour over and above the ordinary routine work, and it must also be borne in mind that the reorganisation of the Sanitation Section of the Department will considerably increase the work of the Staff. I
