SIR,

I have the honour to invite your attention to a question which has been forcibly brought to my notice recently in connection with the Clerical Staff at the Land Office.

2. It has been found that the present establishment is entirely inadequate to deal with the accumulation of work with sufficient expedition to ensure that current business is kept up to date, without continually working overtime.

3. Even so the pressure has shown no sign of decreasing and the health of the Staff has as a consequence suffered considerably. I do not intend to convey the impression that the present state of the Office is due to lack of system

system but rather to the increase of correspondence arising from the approaching auction sales of Government land in connection with which a multitude of enquiries are being made from all quarters. The number of persons who claim special treatment in respect of work done or promises alleged to have been made in the past is surprising and in each case careful investigation has to be made in the Land Office and a report furnished.

4. In these circumstances while I consider it premature to increase the permanent staff of the office I have felt it imperative to do something to relieve the situation and I have accordingly sanctioned the engagement of three clerks on monthly agreements at salaries of £15 per mensem inclusive of all allowances, and trust that my action will meet with your approval. It was the result of a personal inspection of the work in the Office which convinced me of its necessity.

5. The arrangement of the Department and the question of the future numerical strength of the clerical staff will again receive my

attention

attention when the new Land Ordinance comes  
into operation.
