There the honour to adknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the 13th April 1913 enclosing a minute by his Arcellency the Governor dated 24th April 1913, in which I am asked to accept the appointment of Chief Sanitary Officer in this Protectorate subject to the province as laid down by h. - 5. The fees for tuition, examination and registration are paid by the Protectorate funds, but only if I am successful in the qualifying examination held at the termination of the various courses. It follows, therefore, that if for any reason I should be undecessaful, these charges would necessarily be defrayed by myself.
