## Memorial to Her

In 1908 Mr. G. H. P. Lady Jenner proposed to erect a head stone or tablet with the inscription of a memorial to be son of Mr. John T. Lewis and C. O. of Substant who was killed by Somalis in 1900. The memorial was to be useful to the natives of old water tanks for the refuge which were erected with an inscription on marble attached.

It was from Sir T. H. Ward's minute on 2nd Jan 1910 that we understand that the stone was regarded as a casual receipt and added to the Govt Reserve (see also minute on 2nd Jan 1910) a addit to the minute paper which made the stone. There was to be no fund set apart for the maintenance of this memorial, but the Protto would be liable to keep it in repair, according to such expenses as the Estimate.

The Protto is in favor of this day, & will speak of the "memorial fund" though a sum of £1000 has been set aside for the maintenance of the Protto.

I have the honour to refer to Lord  
Crew's despatch No. 581 of 16th November 1908  
on the subject of the erection of a memorial  
at Kisumu to the late Mr. Arthur Jenner.

1. In the first instance the memorial  
took the form of a tank to hold rain water from  
the catchment area of two Military Barracks  
attached to which was a marble slab with an  
inscription sent by the Dowager Lady Jenner.  
These buildings have now been removed and the  
tank is in consequence rendered useless and  
the monument as a whole now presents a desolate  
and isolated appearance.

2. It is proposed, therefore, to remove  
the

the memorial and re-erect it in the central square of the town in front of the Eareza Hall which is also a Magistrate's Court. The tanks will be provided with a tap and the marble tablet will be inserted into the wall above the entrance of the Hall. The amount standing to the credit of the memorial fund at the National Bank of India is Rs. 168.15 cents and this will be sufficient to meet the cost of carrying the alteration in question into effect.

4. I consider that this would be a much more suitable arrangement, and would ask that the Dowager Lady Jeuner be informed of what is proposed with the request that she will express her approval of the scheme should she have no preferable alternative suggestion to make.
