under the CO we have heard nothing of the disease until now. It is curious that it has not been mentioned in the N. J. of the 1st of last year. You will find an account of the disease at pp: 157-164 of the accompanying book by Prof: Osler (The Principles & Practice of Medicine).

I think that we ought to find out what has been done in the way of investigating the disease in the country, & try to separate in the colonies. We have at the present time a balance of £1200 available from the Tropical Disease Research Fund for research work, & the Cte might be willing to make a part from that sum. We might also be able to interest the Schools of Trop. Medicine. Further we might be able to get some assistance from Prof: Nuttall, the Senior Professor of Biology at Cambridge (see top of p. 159 of Prof: Osler's work). We subsidize Prof: Nuttall from the Trop. Disease Research Fund & I am confident that he will be anxious to assist in every possible way.

May I tell the Cte of the Trop. Disease Research Cte that the S. J. S. is anxious that they should look into the whole question & see what can be done?
