I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 550 of the 11th of July respecting the Leave Conditions for this Protectorate and to inform you that I concur with the proposed alterations thereto.

2. With regard to the Steamship Service I am of opinion that, so long as the British India Steam Navigation Company continue to use vessels with inferior accommodation, officers should not be compelled to travel by that line, and, further, that in the case of officers returning from leave, the present rules should be adhered to in respect of those who elect to make use of the Union Castle line only.
