Sir,

With reference to Mr. Bowring's telegram No. 156 of the 14th ultimo,* I have the honour to inform you that the following telegram has been received from Professor Simpson:-

"Spurrier recommends Dr. Freitas in Zanzibar for plague work. He was paid Rs. 400 monthly. I think he might be engaged".

2. I have accordingly made arrangements with the Zanzibar Government for the service of Dr. Freitas to be lent for two months and for this Protectorate to be responsible for his salary at the rate of Rs. 400 per mensem.

3. In view of the difficulties experienced in obtaining house accommodation in Mombasa, I have sanctioned the payment of the cost of his lodging, and also the grant of travelling allowance to him at the rate of Rs. 4 per diem. These items will be a charge against the Emoluments of the six Special Medical Officers mentioned in the telegram under.
