I still doubt the wisdom of the O.G.'s
in not jumping at the suggestion
to promote clerks now in the
service - I doubt if I follow
his reasoning. But the matter
is not perhaps of sufficient
importance to justify this dept
in resisting the O.G.'s views.

But if we do tell C.A. to
obtain 2 clerks for E.A.P.
at £175-60 - £200, I'd
simply say that they are engaged
for service as clerks (not
head clerks) in the P.W.D. &
are liable for service in any
other dept. wh. Gov. may
wish. [This proviso is found
very useful in Hyderabad.]
I send O.G. a copy of an
letter to the C.A. saying that
O.G. has acted on his
recommendation, the reason for

altogether clear - explain the

these men are engaged on
the same salary as other clerks
it seems desirable for the
present to avoid comparison
