You will notice that in 1852 I had a reminder of telegram sent to the alleged excess on Mbagadi expenditure & the applicant proposed (para 2 (at end) of encl. to 1852) to treat it from the loan. The result is, apparently, that there is an excess on Mbagadi expenditure, but that it will not be met from loan funds but (through your ruling) ~~restored to~~ ~~maintained~~ ~~alternatives~~ by a further payment in respect of Mbagadi expenditure.

The S.R. have not been able to trace the ruling in question. If it relates to the original arrangement for Mbagadi
