Sir,

I have the honour to report that, on the instructions of the Director of Colonial Audit, a query has been submitted to this Government by the Auditor respecting the non-inclusion of officials of the Uganda Railway in the Quarterly Returns of appointments rendered in accordance with Colonial Office Regulation 397 (i) and (ii).

2. Hitherto the details regarding appointments on the Uganda Railway have been omitted from these returns. So far as the Subordinate Staff is concerned the General Manager has special powers as to their engagement, dismissal and promotion. They have, therefore, not been regarded as coming within the ordinary terms of the Colonial Office Regulations and it would not appear necessary for them to be included in the returns referred to.

3. I consider that, so far as these members of the Staff are concerned, the present arrangement should be continued. As regards the superior, and generally pensionable, Staff, however, the position is different and I think that they should in future
