Sir,

In receipt of your despatch No. 12 Treaty (20889/13)

of the 23rd ultimo, I addressed a note to the Minister for Foreign Affairs stating the reasons why it was not possible for His Majesty's Government to accede to the request of the

Belgian Government for the surrender of the fugitive offender Mr. Kapsopoulos from British East Africa and explaining

that if extradition were impracticable it might be possible in certain circumstances for the Governor of the East African Protectorate to deport the man as an undesirable if the

Belgian Government would supply His Majesty's Government

with the "dossier" of the case and if the facts thereby disclosed were of a nature to make deportation permissible under the provisions of the Immigration Restriction Ordinance of 1906.

I now have the honour to enclose copy of the reply which

states that it is not the intention of the Belgian Government

to


