

Your telegram No. 13 of ~~#~~I forwarded to you a despatch on this subject on  
June 28th by bag.

If compensation in rifles were granted, they would  
be taken from the Government stores of old rifles, and  
not collected on the frontier, and thus nothing would be  
done to relax the trade or relieve the situation on the  
frontier.
