



With reference to your despatch No. 466 of the 10th ultimo respecting the proposal made by the French Government for ~~the meeting~~ of a commission to prepare for the adoption by the different governments interested of similar regulations for the limitation of the weight of elephant tusks for trading purposes, I transmit to Your Excellency, herewith, copy of a letter on the subject from the Colonial Office.

I have to request that Your Excellency will make a communication to the French Government in the sense suggested by the Colonial Office and enquire whether they agree to the proposal that the commission should meet in London at as early a date as possible.
