Foreign Office, June 10, 1913 I TRANSMIT to your Excellency herewith copy of a letter with enclosures

from the Foreign Secretary to the Government of India, dated the 14th November, 1912, relative to the right of Muscat subjects to fly the British and German flags.

I should be glad if your Excellency would communicate the facts of the case of Synd Mohammed to the German Government, and enquire whether, in their opinion, this man is really entitled to the flag; as he does not appear, as far as can be ascertained, to be genuinely settled as Tangs. This communication might be made to the Imperial Government as a matter of general interest, on the ground that careful verification in cases of the grant of flags is necessary, in order to secure the proper working of the Brussels Act.
