Sir,

In the absence of the Commissioner of Lands and with his approval I am writing direct to you respecting certain grants for native land applied for by Mr. J. Poulton on behalf of himself and Lady Kenneth Mackenzie, certain correspondence having taken place between the applicants and the Colonial Office at home. I have the honour to state that I have made the necessary investigations regarding availability of land, and absence of local objections, and have granted Mr. Poulton rights of temporary occupation subject to the necessary financial proofs of means being supplied by the representatives of applicants in England to the Colonial Office, it being understood that this would be done, and on our receiving confirmation from the Colonial Office that these proofs are satisfactory we would proceed with survey and preparation of deeds.

Mr. Poulton is very anxious that a letter informing them of our action be forwarded at once to the Colonial Office that matters may be put in train, as he has waited here considerable time before it was possible to
