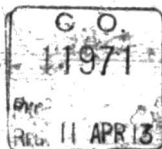

The appointment was then a temporary one but prior to the Colonial Office taking over the S. A. Protectorate in April 1905, the Bombay Office had made Mr. Jeaffreson's appointment a permanent one, with the proviso that it should not be permanent (vide Mr. Bottomley's memo on 10292/1908).

Mr. Jeaffreson's appointment was terminated on April 20th 1908, after having been in post

I am directed by the National Health Insurance Commission (England) to acquaint you that they have received an application (of which a copy is enclosed) from Mr. Charles Berkley Jeaffreson, one of their Inspectors, that his previous official service may be allowed to count for superannuation purposes. Sir,

I most respectfully beg to be allowed to request that my previous Service under Government, in the Foreign and Colonial Offices, may be taken into consideration and that I may be allowed to reckon the same in determining any questions which may arise in my present Service.

In November 1901, I was appointed, by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Chief European Clerk in the office of the Agent General in India for the British Protectorates in Africa, administered by the Foreign Office, and, when, in 1904, the administration was transferred to the Colonial Office my appointment, as a permanent Official, was confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies: this confirmation being conveyed to me with the words, "owing to your excellent services". On the 20th April 1908, I was invalided out of the Service as it was considered a return to the Tropics was not advisable. I have had therefore, 6 years and 5 months service, counting, under the rules of the Service for service abroad, 9 years and 7½ months. I am confident that the Colonial Office would certify that my work under Government would justify this consideration being granted and would venture to point out that it was only ill health which prevented my being still in that Service.
