With reference to letters No. 19635/1913 of the 17th of June, and No. 20730/1913^{act} of the 24th of June I am directed by the Postmaster General to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that Messrs. R. Brearey and R.W. Coates have intimated that they are unable to accept appointment as Postal Clerks and Telegraphists in British East Africa.

The Postmaster General is at present unable to recommend candidates to take the place of Messrs. Brearey and Coates, but he proposes to do so when furnishing the names of the 5 persons recommended for the additional appointments as Postal Clerks and Telegraphists (Male) to which you refer in your letter No. 19639/1913 of the 4th instant.
