Sir,

With reference to your letter, No. 16350/1913 of the 4th of June concerning the impending vacancy for a Female Accountant in the Postal Department of the British East Africa Protectorate, I am directed by the Postmaster General to state for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that we can thoroughly recommend for the post Miss E.E. Lyons, a Second Class Woman Clerk in the Accountant's Office, Dublin. Her present salary is £100 per annum. Miss Lyons is 33 years of age and has served 13 years in the Post Office, 7 in the Money Order Department and the remainder in the Accountant's Office, Dublin. Miss Lyons has an all round experience of Post Office accounts, is forceful, reliant, and writes and speaks German.

The Postmaster General is unable to recommend Miss D.K. Smyth whose application was forwarded to this Department in your letter of the 3rd instant, No. 82279/1913.

I am to add that the Postmaster General presumes that, as in the case of Miss W. Leach, the officer selected will be placed at once on the pensionable establishment of the Colony.
