As regards the suggested changes in the currency system of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates and the draft order relative thereto recently received from Mombasa, we have instructed our Mombasa Agents, Messrs Hansing & Co, that should the new order be passed into law, we wish them on behalf of this Bank to do all they possibly can to assist the Government in their programme.
