Sir,

I have the honour to address you on the subject of providing for more efficient supervision in sanitary matters over the area in the vicinity of Kilindini Railway Station.

Form

2. The present system, whereby the Sanitary Inspector engaged by the Uganda Railway is called upon to attend to matters connected with medical sanitation as well as to perform the duties required of him by the Chief Engineer, is one which, though it may have been satisfactory in the past, is now fully conducive to efficiency in view of the rapidly increasing population of the area concerned and the more arduous duties of the Railway Staff.

3. I am strongly of opinion therefore that a fully qualified Sanitary Inspector should be engaged as soon as possible to devote his whole time to the supervision of sanitation. He would be under the immediate orders of, and directly responsible to, the Medical Officer of Health, Mombasa, but as his energies would be entirely

confined to the administration of a railway area, his salary would be charged to the Uganda Railway Vote.

4. The General Manager has expressed his concurrence with this proposal and under the circumstances I consider that the salary, which should be at the rate of £200 per annum rising by annual increments of £10 to £250, might properly be debited to Abstract (A) V.6 of the working estimates for 1914-15.

5. I trust that this recommendation may meet with your approval and that the post may be filled as soon as possible. The usual form showing particulars is attached.
