I am directed by Mr Secretary to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as Conveyancing Assistant in the Land Dept of the Colony with salary at the rate of £200 a year rising by annual increments of £15 to £400 a year. Full first class papers will be provided by the Govt. from the 1st of April or clear of a balance

2. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate and a copy of the leave and passage regulations for civil officers are enclosed herewith, but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. A copy of the regulations as to pensions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed. Should attend to special provisions in paragraphs 115 of the manual in African No. 273  
If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical officers of this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and you will be requested to pay him a fee of one guinea. His report direct to this Department.

I am to request that you will state whether you accept this offer, and, if so, that you will inform me of the earliest date at which you will be prepared to leave for the Protectorate.

5. You should at the same time furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends may be sent during your absence from this country.
