Your last message was received at Nairobi. Following
are three Burmese M-16 carbines, one M-16A1, one
M-16A2 and one M-16A3. The Nairobi Indya

in consultation with the Governor of Uganda. General Ward has now sent a report by telegram to you summarising the existing situation and giving full requirements, if above, for the number of men required for Juba and the number of men required for half company bases and 2 miles to the frontier Nairobi.

To Governor, Uganda.

Position in Jubaland - Colonel Ward advises that three companies should proceed at once to Mombasa and be put in readiness as possible reinforcements would be very material if you would agree. Further operations from this side must be postponed.

Colonial Office.

Having received information from Serenli which appears to be unsatisfactory though it is not final, I am about to obtain the loan of three companies of King's African Rifles from Uganda which I shall keep in Nairobi in case of emergency. The intended operations against the Turkana must be postponed. Colonel Graham is now on his way to Serenli.

The Governor of Uganda agreed with the proposal that three companies should be sent to Nairobi and they will arrive on the 9th instant.

On 6th Feb. 1911 the following telegram was received from the Governor of Uganda at Serenli:-

Serenli, 4th February. Arrived yesterday, 280 rank and file
