Sir,

In continuation of my despatch No. 249 of the 17th of March I have the honour to report that Segi, the Lihon of the Masai, and Ngaroya, one of the Regents, have now expressed their concurrence in the proposal to extend the area leased to the Magadi Soda Company as a site for the settlement at Mile 28.

2. This concurrence is however subject to the provisions outlined in paragraph 6 of my despatch referred to above viz. that an equivalent area in such geographical position as will render it available for the Masai of this district be added to the Reserve, and that the rent derived from the lease of the whole area of 1,000 acres be expended in its entirety for the benefit of the tribe.
