No. 49 paragraph 8 states that Licensees prior to
date of Rules reaffirming notice May 1908 should be
granted leases at rents as contemplated in 1909
Ordinance. This Ordinance proposed rate of rent
five ten fifteen twentyfive cents and leases without
restrictions against assignment. Advise retention
of covenant prohibiting assignment until new
Ordinance comes into force and recommend that
rent should be reserved at rates payable under
licences namely three six twelve eighteen cents.
