With reference to my Confidential Despatch No. 73 of the 25th of April,\* enclosing a copy of Colonel Graham's report of March 30th, I have the honour to inform you that, with reference to paragraph 1, Colonel Graham was correct in assuming that you would consent in accordance with my wishes to allow the Italian R.P. 11 to cross into East Africa.

As regards the other two paragraphs, in reply to the kindness of the Italian officers I may say that I have already sent a letter of thanks to the Italian Governor.
