I have the honour to report that on the night of April 25th last the office of the Recorder of Titles, Mombasa, was broken into, a cash box prized open and the contents viz. Rs.34/- stolen. A tin despatch box containing confidential files was also taken away but this was recovered subsequently.

3. The entrance to the building was effected through a window which was completely cut away at the fastenings.

3. A beat constable passes the front of the office about once an hour but on the night on which the offence was committed none of the three constables on beat duty heard or saw anything unusual.

4. Suspicion rests on the office boy but there is insufficient evidence against him to

enable the Police to take action.

5. I have discussed the matter with my Executive Council and am of opinion that no negligence on the part of anyone responsible for the safe custody of the cash or the files has been shown.

6. In the circumstances I recommend that the amount of the loss viz. Rs. 34/- be written off and I shall be glad to receive sanction accordingly.
