As to the person to take charge of him
 this is not a "provision of articles" but an
 "extradition" case - it is not our business
 but the business of the Russian Govt.
 who have requested his surrender
 to send out officers to take charge
 of him - I find nothing in the
 Treaty compelling us to bring him
 to lay hand hand him over here
 [cf. H. memo 3rd]

In sending the corresp. to FO say that
 we presume that the Russian Govt
 will make the necessary arrangements
 for "A" supra, and also (?) that, as
 under Art. XVI of the Treaty with Russia
 the demanding state pays all
 the expenses connected with the
 extradition we presume that
 Russia will reimburse the
 Vacuum Oil Co. the expenses
 of sending out the identifying
 witnesses
