Sir,

I have the honour to address you on the subject of the appointment of an Assistant Matron for the European School, Nairobi.

2. It has been lately represented that the Matron cannot take charge of sick children as well as carry out her ordinary duties and it is most undesirable that she should be brought into contact with cases of an infectious nature. It is therefore deemed necessary to appoint an Assistant who will be able to take charge of invalids as well as help the Matron generally.

3. I quite agree that an appointment of this nature is desirable especially in view of the fact that the School is now quite full and is likely to continue so. The Matron's salary

is £120 per annum and I think therefore that the salary of the Assistant should be £100 and I hope that there will be no difficulty in obtaining a suitable candidate at that figure.

4. I trust that you will sanction this proposal, in which case I should be obliged if the necessary instructions could be given to the Crown Agents so that no delay may occur in filling the post. It will be necessary to make it clear when advertizing that candidates should have some experience in sick nursing of children as that will form the greater part of the Assistant Matron's duties.

5. There will be no difficulty in providing the necessary funds from savings on the vote of the Education Department.
