Sir,

With reference to your Secret despatch of June 5th 1914, on the subject of the Defence Scheme of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, I have the honour to report that it has not been possible to arrange that Colonel Graham and Colonel Ward should confer together as the former officer has proceeded on leave.

2. Under the circumstances I would suggest that the subject be discussed in the first instance by the Inspector General and Colonel Graham in England. The Acting Governor of Uganda, whom I have consulted, concurs in this view, adding that as Colonel Ward is to return to England in November next he would like it to be arranged that he also take part in the Conference. This is no doubt desirable, but it seems possible that the Inspector General may have left for East Africa before Colonel Ward arrives in London.
