Sir,

I have the honour to refer to your despatch No. 267 of the 20th of March and to inform you that the Acting Provincial Commissioner, Jubaland, has reported that Mabiwo Arap Kinwele, one of the three prisoners removed from Marakwet, escaped into the bush on the 8th of that month and that the local Chiefs who were ordered to return him failed to do so.

2. No trace of him was discovered and taking into consideration the nature of the country, the prisoner's tribe, his lack of provisions and the absence of any information regarding him, little hope can be entertained of his being still alive.
