With reference to your Confidential despatch of the 8th instant and previous correspondence relating to the Mombasa Railway, I have the honour to invite attention to the necessity of material being despatched to this country on a systemized plan.

2. The Manager has not yet been informed of the name of the contracting firm and is therefore unable to address its representatives direct. He therefore asks that the following stipulations should be made.

3. (a) Consignments should not exceed 5,000 tons.
- (b) If consignments up to this amount are sent, a period of six weeks should elapse between them.
- (c) Materials which will be required first should have priority of despatch, e.g. the 50 lb. rails and 75 lb. sleepers should be sent out long before the 80 lb. rails.

4. These arrangements have been carefully planned by the Manager to correspond with the accommodation available at Kilindini and the capacity
