Memorandum

I have the honour to refer to your despatch No. 97 of the 30th of January last on the subject of the uniforms of officers of the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda Police, and to transmit herewith a memorandum by Major Edwards dealing with the question.

- Uniform for Police Officers -

Concerning the question of the uniform for Police Officers vide the correspondence forwarded under cover of your No. S. 7471 of the 17th instant, I recommend as follows:-

Badges of Rank.

Rank.	On shoulder strap.	On sleeve.
Commissioner of Police.	1 Crown 1 Star.	3 rings & diamond.
Asst. Commr. of Police.	1 Crown.	2 rings & diamond.
Superintendents.	3 Stars.	3 rings.
Asst. Superintendents.	2 Stars.	2 rings.
Inspectors & Asst. Inspr.	Nil.	1 ring.

NOTES:- (1). Shoulder strap badges in black.
(2). Sleeve badges in blue braid on both sleeves.

2. The difference remarked on by the Secretary of State in paragraph 3 of his despatch is due to the following issues:-

That at the time of the promulgation of the Uganda Police Regulations the Office of the Inspector General was not as now constituted, that there were no Superintendents, the Force in Uganda was minus European Constables there being no need to distinguish between Inspectors and Constables as in East Africa.

3. The proposals put forward in paragraph 1 will, if approved establish complete uniformity between the two Forces, and it is hoped that they will be approved.
