I herewith beg to forward for your consideration my application for a position with your Dept., preferably in the Revenue Survey Branch.

I have recently returned from British North Borneo, having completed a 3 years contract as Asst. Surveyor, so an acquaintance with life in the region.

I have served 3 years under licensed Surveyors & qualified Civil Engineers, the latter & being in charge of field parties, & returned to New Zealand to enable me to sit for my examination.

Finding now that the 3 years spent in B.N. Borneo (although under N.Z. Civil Eng., Chief Surveyor, himself a qualified N.Z. Surveyor) does not count here, & that it would be necessary for me to carry on here for 3 years more I intend to look elsewhere for a position.
