THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1914.

MEMORANDUM.

This Ordinance was recommitted with the approval of the Secretary of State to the Legislative Council for the purpose of altering the word "detention" to the word "desertion" in Section 36 (b).

2. The Short Title has also been amended by substituting '1914' for '1913'.

3. The Ordinance has been considered by the Secretary of State for the Colonies and may now be assented to and promulgated.
