The main point of the Order is that it gives power to cut roads of access across land already alienated. This is in accordance with the M.S. model.

As regards §7, if I were the odd land holder I should object to having to fence at the new road's boundary. I presume that if the road is left unfenced the new road is liable for any damage done.

THE CROWN LANDS (ACCESS ROADS) ORDINANCE 1914.MEMORANDUM

This Ordinance has been drafted with a view to enable those holding Crown Land under any tenure to reach a public road over Crown Land whether held under any tenure or not yet alienated. The necessity of such a provision has arisen from the fact that some farms are completely cut off from any public road by an intervening farm or farms.

2. The Crown Lands Ordinance 1901 gives the Crown the right to enter and construct roads for the benefit of the public vide Sections 24 and 25. The Crown Lands (Access Roads) Ordinance deals with roads which are not primarily for the benefit of the public. Further it is considered undesirable that public funds should be spent on the construction of roads which do not afford general public utility.

3. The principle followed in the Ordinance is that to be found in the Federated Malay States Land Enactment 1911 Section 6.

4. The Ordinance may in my opinion be assented to and promulgated.

1.	Short title.
2.	Power to make an access road over Crown Land whether alienated or not, vide Crown Lands Bill Section 86 and vide Federated Malay States Land Enactment 1911 Section 6.
3.	Compensation payable in respect of the road vide Federated Malay States Land Enactment 1911 Section 6 Sub-section 2.
4.	Power to enter and construct an access road.
5.	The width of the access road not to exceed 20 feet.
6.	Maintenance of road vide Federated Malay States Land Enactment 1911 Section 6 Sub-section 2.
7.	Fencing not compulsory.

Section.	Remarks.
8.	Conservator of Forests is entitled to an access road to Forest areas or demarcated or reserved Forests.
9.	Saving for proclaimed or reserved roads vide Crown Lands Bill Section 85.
