issued for the moiety (£12,244-1s.)

With reference to your despatch No. 643 of the 10th of July on the subject of the payment made for Dr. Charlesworth's land, I have the honour to inform you that the sum of £500 referred to was paid by the Mombasa Treasury Office to the credit of his account with the National Bank of India Limited, Mombasa, on the 25th of June, 1914.

2. This sum forms a portion of the award of £24,488-2-0 which, in accordance with your instructions, was met in equal parts from balances and from the £375,000 loan. For the portion met from balances a special warrant No. 48 was issued, charged to Railway Department, Special Expenditure, acquisition of Dr. Charlesworth's land, Kilindini.
