The position is not quite the
same as between expenditure on

rotated services and expenditure from loan funds. In the former case there may be excesses, which must be authorized by special warrants, but in the latter case, while a gross excess is admissible any re-appropriation of the loan funds must be specifically authorized. In this case the constant charges to loan funds was duly authorized as an item of expenditure to be met from the loan, and a special warrant was issued for the moiety (£12,244-1/2) charges to rotated services. This seems to me to be sufficient.

With reference to your despatch No. 643 of the 10th of July on the subject of the payment made for Dr. Charlesworth's land, I have the honour to inform you that the sum of £1500 referred to was paid by the Mombasa Treasury Office to the credit of his account with the National Bank of India Limited, Mombasa, on the 25th of June, 1913.

2. This sum formed a portion of the award of £24,488-2-0 which, in accordance with your instructions, was met in equal parts from balances and from the £375,000 loan. For the portion met from balances a Special Warrant No. 46 was issued, charged to Railway Department, Special Expenditure, Acquisition of Dr. Charlesworth's land, Kilindini.
