Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the administrative establishment of the Tanaland Province in connection with the draft Estimates for 1915-16.

2. The Provincial Commissioner, Mr. Isaac, has pointed out, I consider with justice, that his predecessor considerably underestimated the requirements of Tanaland when he only asked for two District Commissioners and one Assistant District Commissioner, which was consequently the staff calculated for in my despatch No. 397 of May 27th

3. The Tana River District is very extensive and owing to the pressure of Somalis in the northern part of it requires the presence of at least two Assistant District Commissioners besides the District Commissioner. The Lamu District also certainly needs an Assistant District Commissioner and I have in point of fact found it necessary to

provide one, though the existing establishment does not contemplate such an appointment.

4. I would therefore ask that the number of Assistant District Commissioners be increased by two and am making provision in the draft Estimates with that object.

5. I may mention that Mr. Ainsworth's scheme which was enclosed in my Confidential despatch No. 146 of September 1st takes no account of any additional staff for Tanaland. He has no very recent experience of the province and has merely taken the existing establishment as sufficient. I am quite satisfied that this is not the case and, whether or no his scheme is introduced next year, I feel **sure** that the increase for which I ask is necessary.
